Instructions:



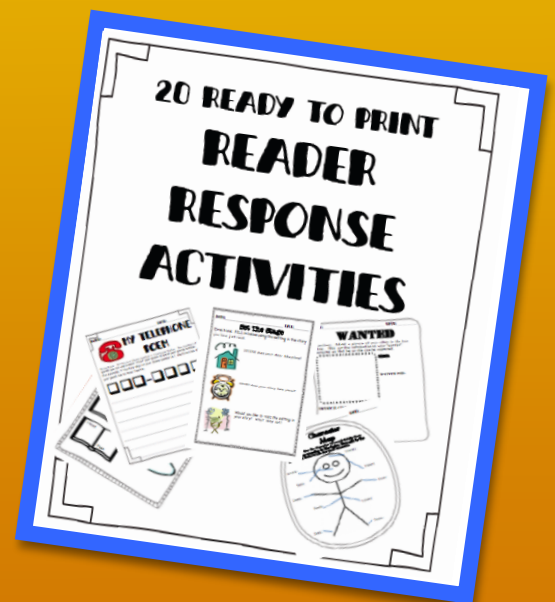
Mathematics Warm Up

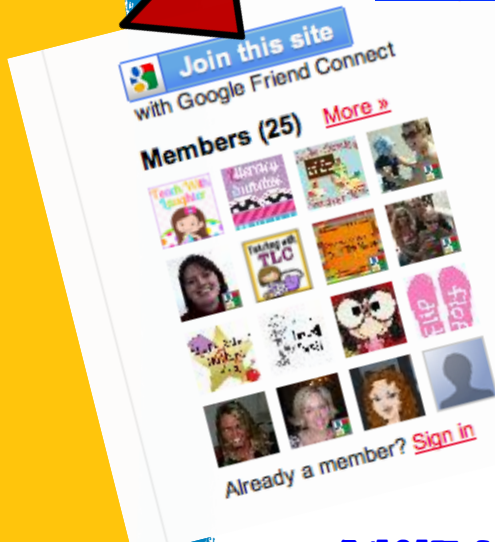
Reader Responses
